3. Member Spotlight:

Felicia Coffman, RPCV Suriname, 2004-2007



1) Short description of your Peace Corps Service.

My official title was "Non-Formal Educational Extensionist". This essentially meant that I taught anything that I actually knew how to do and anything anyone was interested in learning. Being a recent college grad, this limited my options to teaching English and begging for money. Therefore, I taught English and grant writing in the Saramaccan village of Gengestone in Suriname, South America. The grant we wrote funded a project to build a Kindergarten school and women's center. I extended for a year as the Peace Corps Volunteer Leader(PCVL) and also taught computer literacy at the Cultural Center Suriname in the capital city, Paramaribo.

2) Fun fact about your host country

Suriname is slightly bigger than the state of Georgia.

Although Suriname is in South America it is actually considered a part of the Caribbean due to cultural and economic ties. Oddly enough the official language is Dutch.



3) Fun fact about your host community

Genge means "bell" in Saramaccans, the local language. Gengestone is named after a massive bell shaped boulder at the riverfront entrance of the village.



4) Most unique part about your Peace Corps service

Having a love/hate relationship with sting rays. One the one hand they made for good eating. On the other, they caused serious injury during the dry season as they lay trapped under the river bed sands left by the receding tide. On the third hand (if that's possible), I believe having photos of a child's injuries from one of these creatures while crossing the river to go to school made all the difference in having our grant funded.

5) What you are up to now

I am now working for the Unaccompanied Refugee Minor Program at Catholic Charities. I am the Independent Living Skills Coordinator for refugee youth aging out of foster care.
